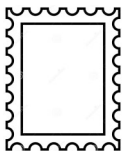

Dear Church Family,

September is Here!

Every September,
the rhythms of life change
once again. Vacations

wind down, routines resume, and we find ourselves gathering once more as a church family. In September, Back to Church Sunday is observed by many Christian congregations nationwide to encourage church members to invite friends, neighbors, and family to return to a church community. But Back to Church Sunday is more than just filling the pews; it's a reminder that God is always inviting us into renewal and transformation. I want you to hear a profound truth: God is always at work and in the business of transformation. Repeatedly, Scripture demonstrates that when people encounter the living God, their lives are transformed. Saul becomes Paul. Fishermen become apostles. The lost are found, the broken are healed, and the weary are made new.
