

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Church Family,

As we enter the sacred season of Advent, it's a wonderful time of waiting—not the kind that's just about watching

the clock, but a heartfelt, hopeful anticipation. Advent encourages us to slow down, take a deep breath, and open our hearts to God coming close. The Scripture invites us into this gentle expectation. As the Prophet Isaiah beautifully reminds us, "*The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light*" (Isaiah 9:2). Matthew also shares the joyful promise fulfilled in Jesus: "*Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,*" which means "God is with us" (Matthew 1:23). Advent reassures us that God's loving presence is drawing near, filling our hearts with hope and peace.

In a world that feels increasingly rushed, divided, and weary, Advent reassures us that God still comes to us—bringing hope where despair has taken root, peace where anxiety reigns, joy where sorrow lingers, and love where fear has built walls. In these weeks, we are invited to slow down long enough to notice the ways God is moving in places we often overlook: in small acts of kindness, in moments of reconciliation, in whispered prayers, and in the quiet courage it takes simply to trust again. The candles we light each week are more than symbols; they are reminders of God's unwavering promise, steady markers that guide us when our own sense of direction falters. They call us to remember that God's light is not fragile or fleeting, but persistent—always seeking, always breaking in. Even the smallest flame can push back the deepest darkness, reminding us that the light of Christ still has the final word.

This season, I invite us to practice *intentional waiting*. Let's carve out moments to reflect on God's promises, to recognize where Christ is being born in our midst, and to prepare our hearts for the transforming hope of Christmas. Whether through worship, prayer, acts of compassion, or simply choosing to be present with one another, may we embody the light we proclaim. As we come together on our journey toward the manger, let our waiting be filled with a sense of wonder and anticipation. May the God who enters our world in humility and grace fully renew our hope, reminding us of the deep love God has for the world.




