

James 1:22 says, "But be doers of the Word, and not merely hearers." It reminded me of Jesus' words at the end of the Sermon on the Mount, "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock" (Matthew 7:24). Jesus goes on and explains that for those who hear his words and act on them will be able to withstand the winds and the rains because they built their house upon the rock. For those who don't put into action these words, they will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand and when the wind and rains hit, it didn't stand. The first question that comes to mind is, "which words am I supposed to be hearing and then doing?" Jesus, in Matthew chapter 7, points back to the Sermon on the Mount, "these are the words that you are to be acting on." James, I believe, is also pointing back to Jesus and saying listen to his words and act upon them.



Mark Twain made this famous quote, "It ain't those parts of the Bible that I can't understand that bother me, it is the parts that I do understand." I find this to be true as well. It's the parts of the Bible that I do understand that challenge me, that push me as I follow Jesus even when it's hard. When I look at the Sermon on the Mount, I am reminded that my thoughts can affect the way I interact with people. I need to take seriously these words and put them into action, to treat people as the Image of God that they are. May we be doers of the Word and may we as followers of Christ take seriously Jesus' words by becoming salt and light to bring change to a world that desperately needs it.
