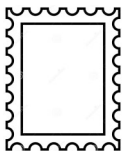

Yolanda opened the meeting at 11:52 by lighting the Christ Candle. All read aloud the Mission and Vision statements and scriptures. Yolanda then prayed.

Minutes – Reading of the minutes was tabled until the October meeting.
