When I am not able to sleep, I will either read the Bible or I will pray. These times are when I have my most creative ideas or where God reveals something to me. This could be an area that I should work on or open my eyes to a problem that I have been wrestling with. From one of my sleepless nights, I was praying, and God revealed to me this sermon series called Breakthrough. Usually when this happens, the idea will come with possible scriptures I could use for the sermon series. This time was rare. I not only had the scriptures, but I also had the sermon titles to go with the scriptures. If we are going to have a Breakthrough as a church or as believers, we first need to Believe big and pray big. This goes along the same lines as Dream Big, a sermon I preached last year. The point of the first sermon is that we need to believe big and then follow that up with praying big. I am reminded of the two blind men in Matthew chapter 9:27-31. They follow Jesus calling out to him, "Have mercy on us, Son of David." Jesus asks them if they believe that he can heal them. Their reply was a resounding "Yes!" Jesus then touches their eyes and says, "According to your faith, let it be done to you." And their sight was restored. The blind men believed big, and I believe as they are crying out, they are praying big, praying that the Son of God would restore them. Their belief and their prayer came together, and they were healed. I believe that we as believers must believe big and then pray big and expect that God is going to move in ways that we have not seen. When I look around at the challenges we face as a community of faith, I am challenged and encouraged that we must believe big and pray big and watch God move. In Matthew 17:20-21, Jesus tells his disciples that if they have faith that is as big as a mustard seed, they can move mountains. Church, we can move mountains! Let us believe big and pray big and watch God move. I challenge you all to spend time in prayer. As we face the challenges ahead of us, let us pray and watch God move mountains.


