Dear Church Family,

I have been sitting with this idea of hope for a couple of years. I have had many conversations with people who are asking the question, "What is hope, and where can I find it?" Some of these conversations came from events in our world, and other conversations came from difficulties that people were going through. The one conversation that, to this day, I have not forgotten. I was working at Mayfair and I had arrived at church after lunch. When a person walking by asked if I had time to talk. My thought was, yeah, that is why I got into ministry. This person shared some of the challenges they were going through, and I couldn't help but hear the desperation in their voice. The comment that still rings in my head was when this person said, "I don't have hope for the future."

After an hour of discussion, counseling, prayer, providing them food, and getting them into a shelter. I walked away from this interaction feeling good, yet something was still bothering me. Now this conversation happened a week after Easter and after hearing during the Easter sermon that we are "the people of the resurrection." I began to contemplate this exchange in light of Easter and Holy Week. I was reminded of the disciples and how they felt that their world had fallen apart when Jesus was crucified. The disciples watched as Jesus entered Jerusalem and people were singing out in celebration to Jesus being arrested and crucified. As I reflected on this conversation, I had an aha moment, and it was that this person was living as if Good Friday was the end of the story.

But it isn't the end of the story. The tomb was not the end! Easter Sunday spoke louder than Good Friday. From the ashes of despair and hopelessness, hope burst forth. In our own lives, we face challenges and moments where we feel there is no hope. May we be reminded that the tomb was not the end of the story and our challenges are not the end of our story. Hope radiated from an empty tomb and rang out. May we become beacons of hope. May we live as Resurrection People who bring the Good News to a world that is crying out for hope. And may our song be "hallelujah!"

This seems drastic but life is like that sometimes. Or at least it feels that way. Things are all rosy and then you fall into a ditch full of thorns. You might feel abandoned and forsaken but God says many times, "⁶Be strong and

courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6, NIV). Jesus never promised it would be easy, he just promised the Holy Spirit would always be with us. We will never be alone! Hallelujah! In Christ's Service
